

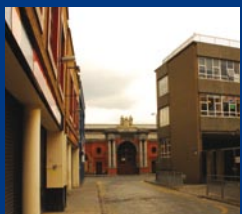

Background

Bradóg Regional Youth Service is a new organisation set up to provide services to the youth of four communities in the north West Inner city; Hardwicke Street, Dominic Street, Dorset Street, and the Markets Area.

Currently the service comprises of a Regional manager, a Project Leader, three Youth Workers, two Outreach Workers, one part-time Activities Worker and one part-time Administrator.

The Service is funded by the Young Peoples Facilities and Services Fund. This funding is administered through the City of Dublin Youth Services Board.

Bradóg Regional Youth Service seeks to support young people within the North Central Inner City area who voluntarily choose to participate in a range of structured activities based on individual needs and lifestyles, enabling young people to reach their fullest potential.
